



Conflict Minerals Statement

There has been increased awareness of the violence and human rights violations in the mining of certain minerals from the location described as the “Conflict Region” which is located in the eastern portion of the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and surrounding countries. Companies around the globe have been requested to practice due diligence with their supply chain to assure that specified metals are not being sourced from mines in the Conflict Region, which is controlled by government military groups or unlawful military fractions.

Detoronics fully supports the position of the Electronic Industry Citizenship Coalition (EICC) and the Global e-Sustainability Initiative (GeSI) in ending the violence and human rights violations in the mining of minerals such as gold, tin, tungsten and tantalum. Detoronics supports the Dodd Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010, and Section 1502 specifically relation to “Conflict Minerals.”

Detoronics does not directly purchase any raw Conflict Minerals from any source and does not knowingly procure any products containing Conflict Minerals from the Conflict Region.

Detoronics suppliers must provide written evidence of due diligence documenting that raw materials such as gold, tin, tungsten and tantalum, do not originate from mining or smelting operations in the Conflict Region. Detoronics remains committed to continue our due diligence working with our supply chain to increase transparency and to ensure that only “conflict free” materials are being used in the manufacturing of our products.
